## Low-Income Missourians Connected to Benefits in 2022-2023

Thanks to federal funding that supports efforts to find and enroll low-income people on Medicare into benefits they are eligible for, 172,492 low-income older and disabled Missourians received assistance that can help them to afford their prescription drugs and doctor visits.

### This federal funding supports Missouri's:

- State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)
- 10 Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs)
- 2 Benefits Enrollment Centers (BECs)



Funding also supports BenefitsCheckUp®, a free online screening and enrollment tool.

# These organizations help older adults making less than \$22,000 a year apply for:

- Medicare Part D Low-Income Subsidy (LIS/Extra Help)
- Medicare Savings Programs (MSPs)



### Missourians in Need Found Help...

Thanks to previous federal funding, in 2022-2023:

- 114,492 Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers in Missouri received help with access to low-income benefits
- 58,000 Missourians used BenefitsCheckUp® to connect with benefits online

### ... But Far Too Many Are Still Missing Out

 395,096 Medicare beneficiaries in Missouri are living at or below 150% of the federal poverty level and need help affording health care

### Joe's Story



Joe lived on less than \$1,000 per month. He applied for a Medicare Savings Program, but never heard whether he was approved. A benefits counselor called the state and discovered that Joe's application had been missed. Recognizing the error, the agency turned on the benefits to help Joe with his Medicare Part B expenses and set them to be retroactive to the day he applied.
